og Lane Café, our latest sister restaurant is scheduled to open in September in the Storrs Center. Our new address, One Dog

Lane, is on the corner of Route 195 and Dog Lane. The Storrs Center project, a collaboration among the town, the university, and state and private developers, will produce a pedestrianfriendly mix of shops, restaurants, housing and entertainment in a village setting. With access to public

transportation, Storrs Center represents the essence of smart growth. The long-range plan for Storrs Center is based on developing a destination area where it is busier in summer than it is in the wintertime.


The Vanilla Bean Café draws customers from areas close and far mainly because we serve healthy and often locally grown food. The Café has been described as so homey it is difficult to leave. Dog Lane Café will not be a clone of "The Bean," but will have some of the same appeal. The breakfast menu will consist of made to order omelets and breakfast sandwiches as well as healthy grab and go items such as fresh fruit, muffins, bagels, croissants and yogurt. Items on the regular daily menu will be served throughout the day, made to order and include sandwiches, salads, and soups. Menu choices will include grilled chicken, hamburgers, hot dogs and vegetarian options along with a variety of soups, chilis and chowders. Also customers will find bakery items, daily specials and beverages - coffee, teas, Hosmer Mountain Soda and a limited beer and wine selection. Customers will enjoy a comfortable seating indoors or outside on the

patios. And of course, there will be WiFi.

When it comes to operation on a daily basis, we plan to focus on three key concepts: quality,

being "green" and efficient service. Whenever possible, we purchase minimally processed and organic ingredients and we buy from local growers when seasonally available. Recyclable and compostable containers will be used for packaging take out items. Menu items will be served on deli paper

#### Friday - 6 - Chris Smither





The Yankee Dogs (Bill Reid, Louise Muller and Mike Barrette) came together during jam sessions at open mics and discovered a shared love of American roots music. Reid's interest in traditional American music along with

Muller's and Barrette's renown solo work makes for a fun and rollicking time through a catalog of western swing, folk rock, blues, rockabilly, rock & roll, and bluegrass.

# Saturday - 21 -Michael Hakanson-Stacy

Michael Hakanson-Stacy has released his fourth album in three years. He doesn't divert from his passion and proven formula for acoustic folk, blues and gospel music. Unlike his previous albums where he

invited outside musicians (like Brooks Williams) to join him, Hakanson-Stacy plays all of the instruments on Pearls & Stones, preferring the wooden body resonator guitar and metal body dobro. In addition he plays harmonica and mandolin, and sings lead as well as writing a bulk of the 19 selections contained on this album. Among the outstanding pieces on this recording are Rev. Gary Davis' gospel testimonials, "I am the Light of the World" and "I Saw the Light," as well as Hakanson-Stacy's wildly antipodal "Stagolee." Amid the traditional and original gospel, folk and blues vocal numbers are several instrumentals that add a different tenor to this album. "Hakanson-Stacy's blues vocals are tinged with, sarcasm and humor, rather than depression and his guitar playing is crisp, precise and solid." -Valley Advocate





the early '60s. He quickly became a popular performer in the Boston area. In 1971, after one of his performances, a reviewer for The Phoenix stated that Bill was "simply Boston's best performer." A decade later, the annual Reader's Poll of The Boston Globe selected him as a favorite performer. In 1991, Bill entered his forth decade as a folk performer with an international reputation as an artist. Singing mostly his own songs, he has become one of the most popular singers on the folk music circuit today and averages around 200 concert dates a year. Bill weaves a magical blend of wit and gentle humor into his performances, and as one reviewer wrote, "he has a sense of timing to match the best stand-up comic."



day in and day out, **Poor Old Shine** is the Roots-Americana collaboration of Chris Freeman and Will Leet. Traveling with an assortment of instruments

including guitars, banjos, pump organ, string bass, cello, a swarm of harmonicas, and a yard-sale-scrapmetal drum set, it's old songs with a new feel, banjos with paint peeled, shoes with holes and treadless soles, and music that is real. Poor Old Shine's music is rooted in the folk and Appalachian mountain music tradition and fits in well at bluegrass festivals and sticky rock clubs alike. They have been compared to The Avett Brothers, Mumford and Sons, Langhorne Slim, and The Low Anthem because of the changing instrumentation and harmonies. Poor Old Shine also features six UCONN graduate musicians Antonio Alcorn (mandolin, guitar), Scott Thomas McColl (upright bass), Malachai Madden (cello, guitar), and David Norman (organ).

Big Jump is a local R&B neo-soul band who has



been tearing up the crowds at Fred's Brick Oven in Willimantic. Led by the charismatic vocalist Perry Mandanis, the group also features the

swampy lead guitar of Mark Davis, the soulful bass of Lou Chatey and the rock-steady drumming of Frank Busse. From the classic hits of Aretha Franklin and Wilson Pickett to the modern soul sounds of Duffy and Seal, this band will have you on your feet and dancing your blues away! 


