## We Thought You Should Know

ctober 1<sup>st</sup> of 2019, the State of Connecticut implemented a new 1% additional Sales Tax on restaurants. That means the consumer at restaurants will be paying 7.35% sales tax. The State has also implemented a 10% Spirit Excise Tax that will be passed onto restaurants and package stores in wholesale costs. Not only that, but beginning at the same time, the state Minimum Wage increases from \$10.10 per hour to \$11.00 per hour. It will increase every 9 months by \$1.00 until it reaches \$15.00 per hour on June 1<sup>st</sup> of 2023. In 4 years, this will increase the minimum wage by 48%. This will in turn cause menu prices to increase a minimum of 25% in that time frame, but most likely more than that as the increases incurred by our suppliers are passed along to us as well. Throughout this time, we will hold true to our commitment to high quality, hand-prepared foods at all our restaurants. We will implement price increases throughout this time to keep up with this rapid rising cost of business, that is being brought to you by the State of Connecticut.

Ellis Paul is one of those gifted singer/songwriters. Though some may refer to him as a folk singer, he is more, for lack of a better word, a singular storyteller, a musician whose words reach out from inside and yet also express the feelings, thoughts and sensibilities that most people can relate to in one way or another, regardless of age or upbringing. He's an observer, a philosopher, and an astute storyteller who shares with his listeners the life lessons he's learned.



Along with being opener of choice for artists as varied as Aretha Franklin, Arlo Guthrie, and Anita Baker, 2006 and 2007 found Gilbert opening 140+ shows for comedian George Carlin.


## Saturday - 22 -**Amy Gallatin & Stillwaters**

Celebrating the 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary of The Beatles Abbey Road, and honoring its influence across gen-



erations, Pamela Means performs the iconic album, in its entirety, in order, solo acoustic! Her introduction to the Beatles record remains "a vivid memory from age 14," and one of the reasons

she chose to delve into learning the whole album was that "the medley [aka most of side two] seemed so incredibly difficult to learn. It just sounded 'badass' to do it. A multi-talented performer, singer, songwriter, composer and producer, Pamela Means's multiple honors include being named Falcon Ridge Folk Festival's "# 1 Most Wanted New Artist," "Wisconsin Folk Artist of the Year," "Wisconsin Female Vocalist of the Year," and her politically provocative album, Single Bullet Theory, was voted "Outmusic Outstanding New Recording." Pamela Means was twice voted "Best Acoustic Act" of the year in her hometown of Milwaukee, WI; and after setting up shop in the bustling 'burbs of Boston, Mass., Pamela was nominated for an "Outstanding Contemporary Folk Artist" Boston Music Award. Curve Magazine calls her "one of the fiercest guitar players and politically-rooted singersongwriters in the music industry today."

#### Saturday - 28 - Peter Mulvey

Peter Mulvey is a veteran singer and songwriter from Milwaukee, Wisconsin. He began his career on the streets of Dublin, Ireland, as a



busker, and from there moved on to performing in the subways and streets of Boston. This led to his first record deal and a leap to full-time national and inter-

national touring, beginning in the early Nineties. Mulvey is an iconoclast within the singer/songwriter world. Restless and inventive, he has made 18 records, spanning rock and roll, folk, Jazz, spoken word, and Americana. A long-standing gig at the National Youth Science Camp led to a spoken word piece, "Vlad the Astrophysicist", which became a TEDx talk, and then an illustrated book. He has taught songwriting and guitar workshops at the Swannanoa Gathering and at various folk festivals across the U.S. He is best known for his warmly wry songwriting and his intense percussive guitar style. He folds everything he encounters into his work: poetry, social justice, scientific literacy, and a deeply abiding humanism are all on plain display in his art.








#### **Our Pricing Practices\***

**1. Sales Tax Included** - Our prices include the 6.35% Connecticut Sales Tax + the 1% Restaurant Tax. The prices listed on the menu are exactly what you pay. Our prices may seem to be inflated; however, a \$14.00 menu item is actually 13.04 + 9.6 sales tax. Furthermore, this practice makes it easier for the customer, especially if that customer is a child who has exact change for a cookie. What you see is exactly what you pay - what could be simpler?

**2. Not Market Standard Pricing** - We are not trying to fool the customer into thinking that \$11.95 is less expensive than \$12.00. We find this type of pricing insulting to our customers. However, the reason it is used so extensively around the nation is that it works effectively. We don't like that practice, and we also like to believe that our clientele is not so easily fooled.

**3.** No Pennies, Dimes or Nickels - Because our prices include tax and we do not price in the standard way, we do not have to use pennies, dimes or nickels. This is a service to both the customer and to us. We don't give you lots of change, and we only have to use quarters and fifty-cent pieces. 
