### We Thought You Should Know

October 1<sup>st</sup> of 2019, the State of Connecticut implemented a new 1% additional Sales Tax on restaurants. That means the consumer at restaurants will be paying 7.35% sales tax. The State has also implemented a 10% Spirit Excise Tax that will be passed onto restaurants and package stores in wholesale costs. Not only that, but beginning at the same time, the state Minimum Wage increases from \$10.10 per hour to \$11.00 per hour. It will increase every 9 months by \$1.00 until it reaches \$15.00 per hour on June 1<sup>st</sup> of 2023. In 4 years, this will increase the minimum wage by 48%. This will in turn cause menu prices to increase a minimum of 25% in that time frame, but most likely more than that as the increases incurred by our suppliers are passed along to us as well. Throughout this time, we will hold true to our commitment to high quality, hand-prepared foods at all our restaurants. We will implement price increases throughout this time to keep up with this rapid rising cost of business, that is being brought to you by the State of Connecticut.



Some artists document their lives through their music. Others chronicle their times. It's a rare artist



who can do both, telling their own story through songs that also encapsulate the essence of people and places who have helped define their era overall. Woody Guthrie comes to mind, and so does

Bob Dylan. Bruce Springsteen certainly as well. Yet few others, for whatever genius they may possess, can relate their own history to the history experienced by those who find that common bond, be it in a coming of age, living through the same realities or sharing similar experiences. **Ellis Paul** is one of those gifted singer/songwriters. Though some may refer to him as a folk singer, he is more, for lack of a better word, a singular storyteller, a musician whose words reach out from inside and yet also express the feelings, thoughts and sensibilities that most people can relate to in one way or another, regardless of age or upbringing. He's an observer, a philosopher, and an astute storyteller who shares with his listeners the life lessons he's learned.

Once word got out about Gilbert's stage-owning singing and playing, Shawn Colvin invited him to be special guest on her Fat City Tour. Noted not only for being the ever consummate performer, Gilbert has recorded 12 albums, including 4 for Philo/Rounder Records and a duo album with friend Ellis Paul. Along with being opener of choice for artists as varied as Aretha Franklin, Arlo Guthrie, and Anita Baker, 2006 and 2007 found Gilbert opening 140+ shows for comedian George Carlin.
